Applications are submitted electronically through "TEACH Online Services," at the Office of Teaching Initiatives website as follows: <u>www.highered.nysed.gov/tcert</u>

HOW TO APPLY

- 1. Click on "TEACH Online Services." If you do not have a NY.gov TEACH account, you must create one. If you have previously created a TEACH account, click "Login to TEACH." If you have forgotten your username and/or password click on the links to regain your access or you may contact the NYSED TEACH Helpline directly at: (518) 486-6041.
- 2. Once the log in is complete, click on "Apply for Certificate."
- 3. The area of interest is **Coaching**. The subject area is also **Coaching**. The title is the sport that will be coached. Select a Regional Certification Office to review your application. This office is listed as **Onondaga -Cortland -Madison BOCES**.
- 4. The last step is payment. There is a **\$50.00** charge per application.
